

Letters demand inquiry into murder of SEP supporter in Sri Lanka

The *World Socialist Web Site* (WSWS) has already received copies of a number of letters sent to Sri Lankan authorities demanding a full investigation of the murder of Socialist Equality Party (SEP) supporter, Sivapragasam Mariyadas.

Mariyadas was killed on the night of August 7 at his home in the rural town of Mullipothana, 20 kilometres from the eastern port of Trincomalee. At about 9.30 p.m., he went to the door after hearing someone call out his name in Tamil. A gunman shot him in the forehead and neck, then fled on a waiting motorbike. Mariyadas died instantly.

The most likely culprits are the Sri Lanka military or associated Tamil paramilitaries. Mariyadas was killed following heavy fighting between the army and the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) in the neighbouring districts of Muttur and Marilavu. Security forces heavily patrolled Mullipothana, making it difficult for anyone to move unchallenged in the town at night.

Moreover, in the wake of the murder, the military deliberately spread rumours that Mariyadas was an LTTE supporter, including at his funeral in his hometown of Selvanayagapuram. Mariyadas's murder is part of a broader campaign by the military, particularly in the North and East of the island, to intimidate and silence any opposition to the government's renewal of civil war.

Over the past 10 months, violence has escalated against Tamils in Colombo and the northeast, including against members of parliament and journalists. In none of the cases where the military or paramilitaries were suspected of involvement has there been a serious police inquiry. The most recent outrage involved the murder of 17 local aid workers attached to the French-based Action Contre la Faim (ACF) in Muttur just days before Mariyadas was killed.

SEP general secretary Wije Dias last week wrote to the Sri Lankan media, enclosing a copy of the SEP's statement "Sri Lankan SEP demands full investigation into murder of Sivapragasam Mariyadas". Last Saturday, the *Island*, an English language daily, published a prominent article on page 2 on the SEP's demands for a proper investigation. Yesterday, the widely read Tamil newspaper *Thinakkural* republished the SEP's statement in full.

We urge our readers and supporters to support this campaign by sending protest letters to the Sri Lankan authorities demanding a full inquiry into the murder of Mariyadas.

Mariyadas was assassinated on August 7 in the eastern district of Trincomalee. His killing had all the trappings of a politically-motivated execution, and one, moreover, that appears to have had at a minimum the tacit support of security forces.

I assure you that an international audience is following this case with the utmost interest.

We, students at the University of Illinois, demand that you carry forth the duties of your office by opening an investigation without further delay.

The Socialist Equality Party in Sri Lanka and the World Socialist Web Site have announced that their supporter Sivapragasam Mariyadas was shot dead at his home on August 7.

As the president of Central Bank Employees Union, I strongly oppose these actions and urge you to hold a full investigation into the assassination and bring the culprits to book.
