

Sri Lankan SEP to hold election meetings

The Socialist Equality Party (SEP) has called public meetings throughout Sri Lanka as part of its campaign for the January 26 presidential elections. Its presidential candidate is Wije Dias, SEP general secretary and a member of the WSWs International Editorial Board. Dias fights for a workers' and farmers' government—a Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and Eelam—as part of the struggle for socialism in South Asia and internationally.
