Moreover, the government is now implementing the IMF dictates for deep cutbacks to public spending, including price subsidies, public education and health, that will affect millions of people.

The only means for ending war and guaranteeing democratic rights and decent living standards is through a unified struggle by the international working class to abolish the profit system and establishing a world planned socialist economy. This is the revolutionary perspective that the SEP and its sister parties of the International Committee of the Fourth International fight for.
