The way forward after the Brexit vote

The vote to leave in the referendum on UK membership of the European Union (EU) is a cataclysmic event in British, European and world politics—heralding a period of immense instability and political turmoil.

Already it has provoked massive financial losses and fears in ruling circles of the breakup of the EU. A right-wing coup has been launched in the Labour Party against Jeremy Corbyn and a new prime minister anointed without election by the Conservatives.

The Leave vote was a cry of social distress and anger, particularly from the poorest layers of workers. Yet the only certainty is that the assault on the working class will be intensified, as the ruling elite demand greater sacrifices in the “national interest.”

The Socialist Equality Party advocated an active boycott of the referendum, arguing that the progressive and democratic unification of Europe can only be achieved through a revolutionary struggle for the United Socialist States of Europe. All are welcome to the SEP’s public meetings to discuss the way forward after the Brexit referendum.
