If Conservative Prime Minister Theresa May is re-elected on June 8 as expected, workers face the fight of their lives. They must defy not only the government, but also the Labour Party and the trade unions—who will do everything possible to sabotage any and all resistance. Jeremy Corbyn, whose loyalties are to the labour bureaucracy, will never lead such a struggle.

This is the time for decisive political action, not half measures and evasions.
